

HUMMINGBIRD NECTAR PLANTS

You can attract hummingbirds by planting native nectar plants with red, orange and pink tubular trumpet-shaped flowers. Use a variety of native plants to provide sources of nectar throughout the year. Many native plants that provide nectar for hummingbirds also attract butterflies! Get started with [Audubon's Native Plant Database](#) or contact your local native plant society for sources of native plants in your area. **Do not use pesticides or purchase plants that have been treated or exposed to pesticides, especially systemic neonicotinoids.**
